1. **Bacchus, 2009/10, Camel Valley Vineyard, Cornwall, England**
Light, floral and delicate with apple blossom and a racy edge. A really vibrant dry wine that shows the potential of our English vineyards. (1) 12.5% vol

2. **Atlantic Dry, 2009/10, Camel Valley Vineyard, Cornwall, England**
An aromatic and fruity dry white wine - perfect with seafood. (1) 11.5% vol

5. **Pinot Grigio, San Alessandro, 2009/10, *Venezie, Italy***
Light and polished with almost tangible floral notes and a delicate lime and sherbet touch. (2) 12.5% vol

6. **Santa Helena Sauvignon Blanc, 2010/11 *Central Valley, Chile***
This classic Chilean style of Sauvignon Blanc is lively and lifted, with an herbal green pea leafiness and real freshness through the finish. (2) 12% vol

7. **Muscadet de Sèvre et Maine Sur Lie, Château L'Oiselière de la Ramée, Chereau Carré, 2008/09**
Loire, France
Just what a good young Muscadet is all about. A suggestion of sea breeze over new-mown hay, some mineral cool, finished with calm length. (1) 12% vol

8. **Unoaked Chardonnay, Mâcon Villages, Aujoux, 2009/10**
Mâconnais, Burgundy, France
Crisp, and showing off disarmingly fresh, young citrus fruit in its unoaked style. Pure, clean brightness is shown at its best under a screwcap. (2) 13% vol

9. **Esk Valley Sauvignon Blanc, 2009/10**
Marlborough, New Zealand
Very lean and grassy with a mineral, citrus zing. It has an added complexity of asparagus pungency and bright nettly notes. Absolutely classic benchmark Sauvignon from that clever Gordon Russell. (1) 13.5% vol

10. **Pouilly Fumé Les Logeres, Guy Saget, 2008/09, *Loire, France***
Classic Pouilly from the central vineyards of the Loire. Crisply refreshing aromatic fruit and an underlying suggestion of flint. (1) 12.5% vol

11. **The Paddock Semillon-Chardonnay, 2008/09, *South East Australia***
Pale and light with gentle citrus and bright apple fruit. A nice bit of weight comes from the Semillon to prop up the fresh character. (2) 13% vol

12. **Rioja, Marques de Caceres, 2009/10, *Rioja, Spain***
Buttery short-crust smooth wine. Dry and rounded, but not oaky. Good white Rioja with individual character and texture in a class of its own. (2) 12.5% vol

13. **Chardonnay, Bodegas Terrazas, 2004/05, *Mendoza, Argentina***
Gold with a green edge. Grown at over 4,500ft altitude, the aroma is very pure and lifted over full tropical fruit. Structure and flavour receive toasty oak support which is finely integrated. Friendly and satisfying, and with some real class. (2) 13.5% vol

14. **GoldCoast Chenin Blanc, 2010/11, *Western Cape, South Africa***
Fresh and bright with lively sherbet and lime aromas and a floral vivacity. Light and zippy with plenty of apple and pineapple with citrus flavours lifted up into a racy, mineral finish. Just brilliant. (2) 12.5% vol

15. **Chablis, Le Manoir, 2008/09, *Chablis, Burgundy, France***
Attractive young Chablis with its cool signature style of wet pebbles. (2) 12.5% vol

16. **Meursault 1er Cru, Château de Blagny, Louis Latour, 2001/02, *Côtes de Beaune, Burgundy, France***
Lemon colour. Soft, rounded, rich Chardonnay flavours, full of sun and vitality. Plenty of pure fruit character for those who are not looking for oak flavour and weight. (2) 13.5% vol

17. **Riesling Spätlese, Reh Kendermann, 2008/09**
Mosel, Germany
Very pale with green lights. Light and linen-fresh on the nose, with a hint of Riesling's unique petrol signature. Fresh pretty flavours, clean as a whistle, true to Moselle delicacy. (6) 8% vol

18. **Vouvray, Domaine de Vaufruges, Chereau Carré, 2009/10, *Loire, France***
With its floral bouquet, apple fruit and cool acid balance, Vouvray's natural accompaniments are river fish, shellfish and soft cheeses. Its medium-dry softness also makes a delightful aperitif. (4) 12% vol

19. **Pinot Grigio Rosé, Via Fordulo, 2009/10, *Azar Neszmély, Hungary***
Elegant and dry but still packed with bright strawberry and raspberry fruit. Very nice and zesty with a peachy character to add a little weight. Rich, fruity and refreshingly crisp it over-delivers in all aspects. (2) 12.5% vol

20. **GoldCoast Pinotage Rosé, 2010/11, *Western Cape, South Africa***
Bright, attractive and friendly, this juicy rosé is packed with strawberries-and-cream fruits. Its dry style and taut backbone lift the summer berry flavours for a generous, easy wine with individuality and character. (2) 13% vol

21. **Rosé Gabriel Ollivier, Vignerons de Grimaud, 2009/10 *Côtes du Provence, South of France***

Youthful, fruity aromas with hints of peaches and strawberries. (4) 11% vol

23. **The Paddock Shiraz, 2009/10, *South East Australia***
A delicious cracked black pepper aroma gives way to a chocolate and spice flavour in the mouth. A big warm, soft, juicy Aussie. (D) 14% vol

24. **Ermita de San Felices Tinto, Santiago Ijalba, 2008/09**
Rioja, Spain
Light and elegant with plenty of summer-pudding red berry fruit. It has a light oak influence that adds weight and concentration. The vibrant violet, cherry fruit is absolutely typical of good Tempranillo Rioja. (C) 12.5% vol

25. **Chianti Rufina, Prunatelli, 2007/08, *Tuscany, Italy***
An open and modern red-cherry-ish style of Chianti, not needing ageing, but that nevertheless holds a haunting note of the wild. (C) 12.5% vol

26. **Château Pierrail, 2007, Bordeaux Supérieur, France**
Smoky dark wine, stirring and waking. Carries a forest signature of wild berries and sweetly charred timber. Very rewarding. (C) 14% vol

27. **The Bluff Pinot Noir, Mount Riley, 2008/09, Marlborough, New Zealand** Fresh and approachable with juicy strawberry and cherry flavours. It is classically light and elegant with a spicy edge but the ripeness of fruit that espouses its New World origin. (C) 13% vol

28. **Fleurie Belle Grâce, Aujoux, 2009/10, Beaujolais, Burgundy, France**
Absolutely classic raspberries and cream nose that is vibrantly attractive. Soft texture and enticing berry fruit are given a little weight of concentration to make it a serious contender. (C) 13% vol

29. **Rioja Gran Reserva Especial, Castillo Ygay, Marques de Murrieta, 2001, Rioja, Spain**
One of the grandest of Rioja names, and from a great year. The fine silky character gives all that could be asked, and the label is pure glory. (D) 14% vol

30. **Santa Helena Merlot, 2010/11, Central Valley, Chile**
Soft, ripe and rounded and packed with plummy spice and red fruit flavours. A very gentle texture supports plenty of blackberry, bramble fruit. A real over-performer. (C) 13.5% vol

31. **GoldCoast Shiraz, 2009/10, Western Cape, South Africa**
Smoky, spicy and brambly with clear notes of clove and cinnamon and a real South African earthiness. Honest and straightforward it has dark cassis fruit with peppery overtones, encased in a silky, soft tannin shell. (C) 13.5% vol

32. **Montes Cabernet Sauvignon Classic Series, 2009/10**
Curico, Chile
Textbook Cabernet Sauvignon, with its garnet colour, very attractive full fruit and new oak on the nose. All nicely-collected and subtly-aged in the mouth, ordered into good balance and finished neatly. (C) 14% vol

33. **Riebeek Pinotage Reserve, 2008/09, Coastal Region, South Africa** Purple hues, red berry flavours with streaks of spiced cigar boxes and gunflint. A wild wine with the typical dusty hedgerow flavours of this grape. (C) 14.5% vol

34. **McHenry Hohnen 3 Amigos Shiraz-Grenache-Mataro, 2007/08, Margaret River, Australia**
This great blend brings together Shiraz juiciness and spice, Grenache sweet ripe fruit and the vivid dark character of Mataro. Combined, they come alive with youthful ripeness and generosity. (C) 14.5% vol

35. **Châteauneuf-du-Pape Les Sinards, Domaine Perrin, 2006/07, Rhône, France** Young healthy powerful Châteauneuf with wall-to-wall fruit and spice flavours. All the character and muscle you could want in a fine fruit coat. Another winner from the Perrin stable. (D) 14% vol
